## Coronavirus

Covid guidance re removal of Plan B measures

The Plan B Covid restrictions imposed as a result of the spread of the omicron variant were removed on January 27th. The updated national CofE guidance on public worship now applies. Full details can be found at:

The guidance states that face coverings

are no longer mandatory in any setting but may be recommended in enclosed or crowded places, particularly where you come into contact with people you don't normally meet.

It is up to individual parishes to decide their own policies with regard to face-coverings, social distancing and ventilation, to keep their congregations and communities as safe as possible.

The Isle of Wight Foodbank has given 5,136 emergency food parcels to support local people in the past 12 months, supported 2,205 Children in the last 12 months and received 5.4 Tonnes of donations last month. help us continue making a life-changing difference for disabled people.

During Covid we have continued our vital mission and are pleased that our new 'Supported Wheelchair Distribution' project, has been a success. A container of refurbished wheelchairs was



sent to Pastor Davis at the Hope of Glory Centre in Elburgon, rural Kenya to meet the needs of disabled people. Lives have been changed, such as ...

Julia, aged 13, who was born with cerebral palsy and has never been able to walk or stand by herself. Her mother was so desperate for a wheelchair they travelled together for 120 miles to our partners from their home on the edge of the capital city, Nairobi. Our Kenyan partners assessed Julia's needs whilst our UK team advised on appropriate equipment size, explained helpful adjustments, and offered encouragement and mentoring remotely using video calls and photos. Julia received a wheelchair, along with a Bible. Her mother was so thankful. She said, "It is an act of love you have shown me." Thanks to your donation we can continue to demonstrate love in action. Despite 5,000 miles separating both teams they united their efforts to enable Julia and others to receive freedom of movement and hope for the future.
