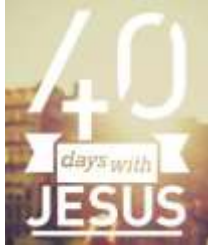


St. Paul's Barton Newsletter 18.03.21

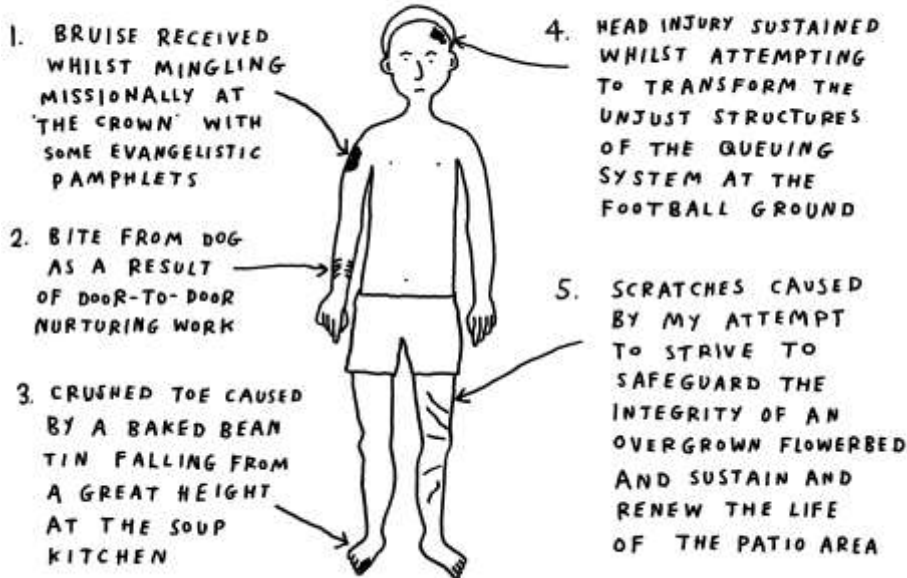

Be An Encourager

So when we could stand it no longer, we thought it best to be left by ourselves in Athens. We sent Timothy, who is our brother and co-worker in God's service in spreading the gospel of Christ to strengthen and encourage you in your faith, so that no one would be unsettled by these trials. 1 Thess 3:1-3

Recent Time

This last year, has been challenging for us all with the pandemic and it will have affected us all in different ways. Some folks, living on their own, unable to socialise, unable to go to church, because of age, infirmity or vulnerability. Many folks we have spoken to, are just longing to have a cuddle, to feel loved by others. As Christians, we know that Jesus embraces us, and keeps us under the shadow of His wing.

However as humans, we were created to have fellowship with one another. Thank God for social media and the internet, but not everybody is fortunate to have these facilities, especially those of the mature generation!

Paul's Journeys

Paul and his companions had arrived in Thessalonica on his second missionary journey in AD 58, and planted the first church in that city. It was also a sea port, trade centre, on the NW corner of the Aegean sea in Greece. Previously, Paul had been with his followers in Philippi, and were treated outrageously. **1 Thess 2** *For we wanted to come to you, certainly I, Paul did, again and again, but Satan blocked our way.* So, Paul sent Timothy to visit, to strengthen and encourage them in their faith, so that no one would be unsettled by these trials.

Building Each Other Up

As Christians, we all have seasons in our lives of discouragement, opposition and separation. Many folks are starved of encouragement and acceptance. Our stiff British upper lip, denies us from admitting our needs. We are afraid of being thought of as weak, or being rejected. We all need each other, we are all equal in God's sight.

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other, so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. James 5:16.

Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. John 13:16.

Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just in fact you are doing. 1 Thess 5:11.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in trouble, with the comfort with which we are comforted by God. 2 Cor 1:3-4.

Fruit From our Labours

The dictionary defines encouragement like this. "If someone is encouraged, by something that happens, it gives them hope and confidence." For example, by telling them what they are doing is good, and telling them, that they should not give up if things are not going so well! Victory in Jesus, will come if we persevere and "keep pressing on."

My wife was given a prophecy many years ago. "Don't let a day go by without blessing somebody." She has endeavoured to do that either by prayer, phone, text letter etc, regardless of perhaps needing encouragement herself. Paul states in **1Thess 3:10** *Night and day, we pray most earnestly that we may see you again and again, and supply what is lacking in your faith. It brings joy to a Christian, to see fruit from their labours.*

Paul had experienced this joy countless times. Only God can change a persons life. But He will use His people to be an instrument in the process to do it. If you don't like what you



are reaping, change what you are sowing! It is not enough just to be courteous to others, we actively have to show unconditional love.

Having an Increase of God's Love

1 Thess 3:12 Paul continues. **"May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for, everyone also, just as ours does for you.** Only God can increase our love for one another. How? Jesus said **"If you have love for one another they will know that you are My disciples."** **John 13:35**

People will be attracted to you. It has been difficult during lockdown, to express our love to others. However, ask the Lord, who needs encouragement today. Send a text, card, or ring them, just to tell them you were thinking of them.

If your capacity to love has waned, ask God to fill you again with His never ending supply. Paul says **"I can do all things in Christ who strengthens me"** **Phil 4:13.**

Finally **v13** **May He strengthen your hearts, so that you will be blameless and holy in the presence of God and Father, when our Lord Jesus comes with His holy ones.** Amen.

In and around the Parish

Two weeks ago we highlighted one of the memorials in the churchyard at St. Paul's. This week in a similar vein we hear from Gary Newman about the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) and his connection to St. Paul's...

EYES ON, HANDS ON - By Gary

The Eyes On, Hands On (EOHO) project is a Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) initiative which seeks to involve local communities in the monitoring and care of many of the thousands of War Graves scattered throughout the United Kingdom.

I applied back in 2019, along with hundreds of others in the UK, to act as an EOHO Volunteer, and help look after some of the War Graves here on the Island. After an unfortunate delay, due to the current pandemic, I was accepted around September 2020 and asked to complete some online training. The training is divided between 'Eyes On' (EO) and 'Hands On'; the EO being how to, safely and respectfully, check grave sites and headstones to ensure they are in good order and to report back to the CWGC. The HO training, again due to pandemic restrictions, has not been undertaken, but when able to, will impart the necessary skills to gently clean and look after the headstones. My areas of responsibility are: East Cowes Cemetery, St Mildred's Churchyard in Whippingham, Newport Cemetery, Carisbrooke Cemetery and St Paul's Cemetery in Halberry Lane. I also temporarily monitor two graves in St Olave's Churchyard in Gatcombe.

I'm an 'Island lad', born, raised and still live in the



parish of St Paul's. My family have a long history with the church, my mother, youngest daughter and myself being christened here as well as my eldest daughter singing in the church choir in the late 1990's. I volunteered for the EOHO project, because having served in the Royal Navy for 35 years, I have an acute sense of duty and having served in Iraq and Afghanistan have seen first-hand the ultimate sacrifice being made. I wanted to honour and ensure these departed brothers in arms are cared for and never forgotten.

What do I look for? Well, that the area around the grave and headstone is neat and tidy; that the headstone is upright, undamaged, clean and accessible; that all badges, emblems and inscriptions are clear, legible and recognisable. This information, along with photographs, is sent to the CWGC via the Area Coordinator, who if necessary, will arrange for repair or replacement of CWGC headstones. However, it must be stressed that replacement is always the last resort as the CWGC has a conservational approach so will only replace if absolutely necessary. After all some of these headstones are a hundred years old and may have been seen and touched by the grieving relatives.

Personal headstones and monuments to war casualties (where the family chose to erect their own memorial rather than accept a Commission headstone), are not under the care of the CWGC but they will still be monitored, to ensure the casualty's name remains legible, and as volunteers, we are asked to monitor these and keep the CWGC informed.

There are eight servicemen laid to rest in St Paul's Cemetery from both the First and Second World Wars, some I know part of their story, others I know very little. So if any of these brave men are your relatives and you'd like to share their story please get in touch.

So if you see a stranger wandering around, looking at headstones, wearing Hi Viz. and holding a clip board, it's probably me. If so, please stop me for a chat as I'm always happy to talk about those in my care.

Don't despise the resistance!

Matthew 5:14-16 You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

In the sermon on the mount, Yeshua said, "You are the light of the world," and commanded us to let our lights shine that we may give glory to our Heavenly Father. This world is becoming more ungodly and dark, and by deep contrast, the saints of the Lord will shine brighter! A candle in a bright room isn't particularly significant or easy to notice. A candle in the darkness shines like a lighthouse and offers the only source of guidance for movement.

When Yeshua (Jesus) warned that the love of many will wax cold (Matthew 24:12), He implied that those who remain

loving will really stand out. The resistance increases; the contrast deepens!

Bodybuilders are familiar with resistance training. They work each muscle group to the point of exhaustion... take a few days off... and the muscle mass increases. The next time they exercise with even more resistance... the result, more bulk! So it is with us in these treacherous times. The darkness and resistance of these evil days requires and will produce greater faith and greater love... if we let them.

This world is testing our love and quenching our light. How will we respond? Will we wimp out, be extinguished, and grow cold? (Matthew 24:12). Or will we recognize that the resistance we face is God's way of building faith and love in His disciples?

Are you exhausted, spiritually spent and on the verge of quitting? Take some serious time out this Shabbat (Sabbath). Rest and reflect on how your love, joy and faith were tested this week. Give thanks for the "resistance" training the Lord has orchestrated just for you, and allow Him to rebuild your spiritual muscles while you rest. You will return on Monday ... more spiritually ripped in His love, and wrapped in His light!

Gafcon works to guard and proclaim the unchanging, transforming Gospel through biblically faithful preaching and teaching which frees our churches to make disciples by clear and certain witness to Jesus Christ in all the world.

On the Isle of Wight we want to faithfully work out the goals of Gafcon Global, by:

1. Proclaiming Christ faithfully to all people.

3. Providing a 'home' for anyone looking for authentic Biblical Anglicanism.

Rev. James Leggett, Rev. Mark Williams and Rev. Dozie Momen lead four churches on the Island. An Open Letter on behalf of UK Christian Event Leaders - March 2021

We know that life is difficult for all of us right now. Being separated from those we love and unable to be together as families is painful. It is therefore with sensitivity, that we need to share with you about some of the challenges faced by Christian events.

Whether under a canvas roof, a big top or an open sky, it was always under an open heaven where God revealed Himself to us and our lives were never the same again; that moment where a glimpse of His glory brought salvation, healing, restoration, and the beginning of a new adventure of faith for you, or your family, or your church.

Christian events in the UK have a legacy that has impacted millions, and that legacy is refreshed year on year as more come to faith and respond to God's work in their lives. Christian events create space for us to come away from the day-to-day routine and for God to impact us. This has birthed new ministries, charities, and dreams in us which have gone on to bring cultural transformation and support the mission of the church.

But now, the Covid-Pandemic has had a profound impact on us all both practically and financially.

As we contemplate two years without gathering in the normal way, we have had to rapidly learn to meet in new ways - either online or in smaller hybrid events. We have all seen a change in this time - 'free' is becoming increasingly expected, but 'free' comes at a high cost for us. So, from us all in the UK that run a Christian event, we need you to know that most of us just can't do it.

Standing together as Christian event leaders, we're asking for your help this year.

No organisation is the same - we have different funding models for our events and festivals. Although it may be tempting to compare us and our different approaches, this really doesn't help you, or us.

In terms of our responses - some of us have postponed, some of us have moved to free digital alternatives, some to chargeable digital or hybrid events. We have all had to take the decision that is best for us in our unique situation now and for running our events in future. Some of us are underwritten, some have reserves, some have other areas of 'business' that can subsidise events. Many of us have none

of those things and rely hugely on ticket sales from our events to keep afloat.

If you want to see Christian gatherings survive, then now is the time we need your prayerful and practical support. We need people like you to stand with us financially, and to support us in any way you can - so that we are all here to gather again in 2022.

We're standing together now and ask you not to compare us, or even worse - to use the approach of one of us to publicly criticise another. Behind the scenes we all stand together, support and cheer each other on. **It is Kingdom we serve, not competition.**

The gospel brings freedom and is free to share. However, putting on a gathering where that truth is celebrated is not free. Gathering thousands together takes infrastructure and so much more and we simply cannot do these things for free. The very many elements that are needed to keep organisations running so that they can put on the spring and summer gatherings you love, need financing.

3. Consider a donation even if you can't go.

If you would normally plan to attend an event or festival this year and consider yourself 'a regular' please consider do-

nating - even if there is no event in 2021/a free alternative, or you can't go this year.

4. Sow into our future

If you are blessed financially please consider a one-off gift if you are able. A gift in 2021 - this is the make-or-break year for some of us and your gift could make the difference.

Lent Bible Study Notes - Week 5



INTRO

We're looking today at the Great Commission and discovering our life's mission. Have you ever wondered what on earth you are really here for or looked into the whole question of discovering our purpose in life?

The answer to this is something Jesus focused on significantly during the 40 days after His resurrection. One of the focal points of His teaching was telling His disciples how they were to continue His mission on the earth. Today we are looking at a particular incident when Jesus appeared to His followers on a mountain in Galilee. There are two things we are going to look at concerning our life mission:

1. The source of our mission is Jesus.
2. The goal of our mission is transformed lives.

BRING YOUR BIBLES

Read aloud **Matthew 28:16–20**, encouraging everyone to follow along in their own Bibles. The more translations the better as each may highlight something different.

Now allow the whole group the opportunity to share what stood out anew to them and why.

QUESTIONS

1. [If your church are running the 40 Days with Jesus sermons] What particularly impacted you from Sunday's message?
2. [If you are using the small group videos instead] What particularly impacted you from this week's message?
3. Read verse 18. How does our understanding of who Jesus is affect our understanding of who we are and what our mission is? Are there other factors or people in our lives who might try and influence our calling?
4. In verses 19–20 Jesus lays out what is known as 'the Great Commission'. What are the three things He calls us to do? To what extent do these three factors influence our daily lives, decision making and conversations?
5. This calling on us as followers of Christ highlights that we are together on a mission. What benefit do you think Jesus sees in us fulfilling His commission together, rather than on our own?
6. Read verses 19–20. Unpack the detail of what 'going and making disciples' involves. On a personal level,

who are we seeking to reach? Think of one of your friends who does not yet believe in Jesus. Imagine or 'see' them when they are fully devoted and in love with Jesus. How do you see them getting from where they are now, to where God would love them to be?

7. Think about this coming week. Where will you be going? Who will you be meeting? In what ways will knowing that Jesus has all authority affect how you think, behave and pray in these situations and settings?

SHARE YOUR STORY

You can discuss the following questions together as one group or, if individuals prefer, you could split into groups of two or three.

8. Verse 17 reminds us that some worshipped, but some doubted, even though the risen Jesus was standing right in front of them! Can you think of a time in your Christian journey when you needed to process some truth about God, before you could fully own it?
9. Verse 18 speaks about the absolute authority the Father has invested in Jesus Christ (authority is the power or right to give orders, make decisions, and call to obedience). What would you do in the name of Jesus, if you knew that you could not fail? Share anything that God is stirring your heart to do.

PRAY TOGETHER

Take the time to invite the Holy Spirit. Perhaps begin with prayers of worship and thanksgiving, then you may choose to follow these suggestions for specific prayer:

You could pray:

- that any doubts in God would continue to diminish so that we can worship and love Him with all our heart, strength and mind
- for a fresh revelation of the authority each one of us has in Christ
- for those we will meet with in the coming week – that their hearts would be prepared and that we would be ready for any opportunity to bring them closer to Jesus.
