

'Tuesday Group' becomes 'Wednesday Group'!

Following on from the weekly Tuesday (Zoom) Fellowship Group set up for the 40 Days with Jesus series, starting on Wednesday 5th May, the group will now meet fortnightly (in term time) on **Wednesdays at 7:15pm** led by Rev. Dr. Dennis Lloyd.

The group will be studying the book of Acts. Rev. Dennis says "The book of Acts is both easy and hard to study. It is easy when we bring a lot of our own thoughts to it, rather trying to discover what Luke's interests were in writing it.

Our hope is to discover Luke's interests and what they mean for us and modern church. If we do the text justice it will both challenge and encourage us. We will look at theol-



ogy, ethics and Christian experience and practice.

As a start, please find time to read the

entire book preferably in one sitting to get the 30,000ft view of the book. If any issues or questions hit you as you read then make a note of them and hopefully we can discuss them in more detail later.

But the most important thing is to read the whole book so that as we study it together in smaller chunks you will have the broader sweep in mind

Read Acts 1 two or three times, reflect on what you read noting any questions or points that may strike you, perhaps for the first time. Pray for understanding as we together seek to discover what Luke is saying to us and what it means for us now. Let us build up and encourage each other for God's greater glory."

Those of you who have managed to join us will no doubt together with me, still be thinking on the blessings of the studies we have now completed regarding Jesus' teaching of Torah, the Purim parashah and the Passover seder. Some of you have already joined in the first of a new study that Rivi is taking us through, the trial of Jesus. The first study has left us considering "who actually went out to arrest Jesus? Was there really a trial?" This study is likely to carry on for another six or so sessions. Integrated with this we are going to do a study on Shavuot (Weeks / Pentecost / Whitsun) at the appropriate time:


Are You Shining?

Matthew 25:23 His lord said unto him, Well done, good and faithful servant; thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy lord.

It was a stormy night in Birmingham, and Hudson Taylor was to speak at a meeting at the Severn Street schoolroom. His hostess assured him that nobody would attend on such a stormy night, but Taylor insisted on going. "I must go even if there is no one but the doorkeeper." Less than a dozen people showed up, but the meeting was marked with unusual spiritual power.

Half of those present either became missionaries or gave their children as missionaries; and the rest were faithful supporters of the China Inland Mission for years to come. Hudson Taylor was going to be faithful to speak even if it was to only one person. Today, God may be calling you to speak to that one person.

D.L. Moody once said: "God has called us to shine, just as area/group of churches. much as Daniel was sent into Babylon to shine. Let no one



say that he cannot shine because he has not much influence as some others may have. What God wants you to do

is to use the influence you have. Daniel probably did not have much influence down in Babylon at first, but God soon gave him more because he was faithful and used what he had."

God is looking for those who are willing to be faithful! He wants to use us in ways we could never or would never have imagined – but in order for that to transpire we need to be faithful in the little things and we need to be available when He calls!

Isle of Wight Deanery Synod News


The lay members of the IW Deanery Synod met on Monday 26th April on Zoom to discuss and provide feedback on the IW Deanery 'Mission Action Plan'. All seven Deaneries in the Portsmouth Diocese are required to produce a plan for the future that has to be approved and agreed by the Bishop/

Although somewhat 'low-key' and seeking more informal outworking at this stage it is clearly a long term plan for formal parish reorganisation say over a 5-year period. It is also apparent that this type of planning is a requirement upon Dioceses in seeking funding from the Church Commission-

Is it all just about money? is the question often asked. Well yes and no. Finance is obviously required to provide paid clergy and a staffed Diocesan infrastructure and ideally

some 'left for over' mission...

need somehow to combat and address longstanding issues over declining and small congregations, falling income, old and expensive to maintain buildings as well as the increasing costs involved in providing paid clergy for small and often rural parishes.

What then is to be done? Locally this current plan/phase/ initiative/idea/scheme etc. (delete where applicable!) is based on grouping churches into 'hubs' geographically and seeking to encourage clergy and parish collaboration to allow for a Team Ministry to be introduced in the designated

The Synod meeting was set up as an opportunity for 'lay' people to explore and express opinions without clergy present(!). This worked well with all those present given an opportunity to speak and present any opinions or ideas etc.

Bearing in mind the implications, the meeting seemed surprisingly poorly attended and of those present some didn't seem to be fully briefed or acquainted with what had transpired so far in this process. This may of course be due to communication issues or changes in representatives following the required re-election of Synod Reps last year.

In general, the response from most parishes would appear to be cautious or just content to keep a watching brief. The

usual concerns relating to any form of reorganisation/change were also voiced - "How will it save money?" Some 'hubs' considered too large. Effect on parish share. Those in authority need to listen more and the possible effects on churchmanship and worshiping tradition to name a few.



Under the current proposals, **Barton** would remain outside the various hubs and work collaboratively with other parishes on the Island sharing our biblically orthodox evangelical churchmanship. I was able to encourage those present with the huge opportunities for promoting the Gospel this approach would leave us with as a parish as well as pointing out the opportunities raised by our relationships with GAFCON and the Evangelical Alliance.

This process is of course ongoing and involves discussion in many areas involving parishes, clergy the Deanery and Diocese. Do please pray for the Lord's will for his church on the Island as it seeks to honour him and move forward. If you would like to know more or see a copy of the current draft of the IW Deanery Plan do let me know.
