

Our Sunday services are all streamed live on the **church Facebook page** and are available to watch later on the church's Facebook page, Website and YouTube channel.


To attend in person you need to book for Sunday services as due to Covid restrictions seating capacity is limited.

PRAYER THOUGHT


Perfected love.

Perfect love dispelling our fear is a theme throughout the scriptures. So many times we are told 'do not be afraid'. Our Heavenly Father knows how we are made, He created us; and He knows how easily fear can take over our thoughts and our bodies.

Fear comes in many guises. We may have a fear of what the future holds for us. Fear of death or destruction. Fear of the darkness around us. Fear of old age. Fear of losing loved ones. Fear of sickness or disability.

All these and more are part of our human condition, and yet God says 'do not fear'. What then is the antidote to fear? To trust God and His character. When we do not trust that we are loved, accepted, cared for and created by our Heavenly Father we lose faith in His promises and fear gets a foothold in our lives.

While the present situation is far from what we would hope it to be, the horizon is looking brighter, (I thought I would avoid the light/tunnel quote!) and thankfully we can say that, while we do not know what the future holds, we do know the One who holds the future, and that is Hope for each one of us individually, as well as collectively for our country, and worldwide.

Obviously, with the ongoing lockdown due to the pandemic, Revive have been restricted in its work, but Pete has forwarded the following updates, and thoughts for prayer in the coming month:

The Living Room Please pray for the team as they prepare for reopening as soon as we are allowed to

do so. We believe the need is going to be greater than ever when restrictions are lifted, as people will be looking for com-

Zoom three times a week, and also through our Facebook profile and Instagram page. While the lockdown has

been difficult for all of us, I think that we all understand that it has hit the young people exceptionally hard, not only on the social aspect, but because of their education, grades, and fears for their future.

Pray that they will be able to meet at TLR again soon, and pray for the team, that they may be able to encourage and give hope to these young people, and be able to share their faith. Pray for Pete as Director, Marie as Lead Youth Worker, and Briony as Assistant Youth Worker.

Newport Food bank Please continue to pray for safety and strength for the team and for the continuing work of the Foodbank, as they are still giving out emergency food every week to many who are in crisis. Pray that people will be stirred to donate supplies at this difficult time, and for all those who come and access the support they give.

- Please pray for Newport, where most of our work is centered. It is a main town and will be greatly affected by this pandemic, so pray that we will be able to be part of the solution, as we move out of lockdown. Please also pray that all our front line workers will be able to get their Covid vaccinations.

Look Out!

Scams...



Trading Standards are receiving a worrying number of reports about a Covid Vaccine Scam email. Having seen a copy of this it is incredibly realistic, and the wording has clearly been taken straight from the NHS.

It will ask you to click on a link to accept your invitation however it will then ask you for personal details and then bank account details. *This is a SCAM* please do not be fooled by the genuine looking branding. You will not be contacted in this way to receive your vaccine and the NHS will never ask for banking details. This email can be forwarded to report@phishing.gov.uk before being deleted.

Trading Standards have had lots of reports this week about a variety of scams that have been plaguing the Island. If you get any of these whether email, phone call or text - ignore/delete them - never click on links in messages or respond to requests in phone calls – these are all SCAMS.

 Email from the Royal Mail that says due to incomplete address they are unable to deliver a

- parcel asking you to click on the link to complete the information required DON'T.
- Email from EE to say that your payment couldn't be taken and asking you to click on a link to verify your details - DON'T.
- Text message allegedly from the DVLA to say that your payment couldn't be taken and asking you to click on a link to make the payment due - DON'T
- Calls from Amazon Prime stating that the annual membership of £79.99 is due for renewal - HANG UP

Remember any unsolicited communication is likely to be a scam so treat them with suspicion!
