As you may know The Living Room (TLR) has had a 'makeover' thanks to a government Covid grant. The kitchen bas been made a bit bigger, we have been given different seating and tables and we now have a new,

to us, pool table (courtesy of a Wight Aid grant)! We were able to open briefly before Christmas, but sadly are now closed until we all bear otherwise. Once we are given the clear to open, we will be opening Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays between 11am - 2pm to start with, and with all the Covid 19 and government guidelines and socially distancing in place.

This year has been difficult for so many people so we are expecting our services to be really needed and are set up to even better, listen to, support and value our amazing customers with the addition of a cafe host amongst other things.

Another big change is that the Newport Youth Cafe (NYC) will be using the TLR building during Wednesday and Friday evenings.

We have already moved out of St. Paul's Christian Centre and have had a trial session in TLR and it has worked well. Behind the scenes we have been continuing our support of the young people we work with through zoom sessions 3 times a week, as well as connection through our NYC Instagram page and Facebook profile. And when we were able, we were going out on the streets connecting with young people and even taking some of our Zoom sessions into the

park. Your continual support has meant a huge amount to us.

We continue to be focused on the churches working together to bless our wonderful community.

Dear congregation of St Paul's Church

Please accept our grateful thanks for your kind donation towards the work of Wheels for the World. We appreciate these are difficult times and are particularly grateful to

receive your gift at this time of uncertainty.

Despite COVID restrictions we still have a vital mission and are adapting activities and methods of delivery to continue to meet our objectives, such as our new 'Supported Wheelchair Distribution', which started this week.

We sent a container of refurbished wheelchairs to our partners, Health Hope Action, to meet the great needs of disabled people from the nearby refugee camp in northern Uganda. A UK team are supporting and mentoring a qualified local team, via voice and video calls, to grow in confidence and take responsibility for distributing wheelchairs. We look forward to hearing about disabled people whose lives have been changed, like...

Lazarus who is 20 and arrived at our Kumi distribution (pre-COVID) carried by his sister Rose. Due to a rare condition called progeneria causing premature ageing, he is nearly blind, unable to walk, has twisted hands and further symptoms of old age. He was fitted with a small wheelchair which the techie team spent considerable time fitting with foam to support his twisted body. The relief on his face as he settled into the chair was immediate. Rose has looked after him since their parents died, 5 years ago, and carried him everywhere. Rose now has freedom to look for work, while Lazarus is celebrating new life through Jesus.

Thanks again for your partnership with us to help people like Lazarus.

Gift to Help Support the Work of CFI-UK

We are grateful that despite the restrictions we have continued our work and want to thank you for giving toward the work of Christian Friends of Israel and the projects we highlight.

Encouraging understanding, particularly within the wider church, we are thankful that CFI UK's contribution toward Holocaust remembering was widely and well received, with over 3,000 viewings by the end of Holocaust memorial week. Some supporters, regional links and church links were able to make this evening premier on CFI UK's YouTube channel available for their churches to show.

Challenging prejudice, we are busy with preparations for this year's CFI/ZF joint parliamentary lobby on the UK's voting record at the United Nations. We are compiling a booklet to give to MPs with input from UN Watch and the Forum for Cultural Diplomacy, providing our speakers for the morning online briefing, alongside the new Israeli Ambassador to the UK HE Tzipi Hotovely. The afternoon lobby will be addressed by members of parliament and House of Lords across the political spectrum.

Assisting community, alongside the generous gifts received following the CFI UK holocaust memorial screening for CFI Jerusalem project Forsake Them Not, this month the trustees allocate remaining monies received by the end of last year for where most needed in Israel.

May our Lord continue to tum darkness into his glorious light through the ministry of Christian Friends of Israel.

Christians and Jews uniting in Prayer

An extract from Intercessors for the Restoration of Israel, Josie Silver. February 13th (From Pam Yates)

Ephesians 4:4-6 "Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."



There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism. (one cry)

In the midst of the massive change we are all experiencing, there is an significant advancement of good and evil.

The increase of evil is very obvious. The increase of good is obvious, if we as intercessors, are knowing the times of the signs in this hour. For those involved in regular national or global intercessory zoom meetings, we see that there has been a huge movement and raising up of the exceedingly great army of global intercessors, since April last year.

Out of the advancement of good, as faithful intercessors gather regularly together, a deeper and more solid unity has, and is being established, which is giving greater authority and power in the spirit realm. The cry of one global voice is ascending from earth to heaven. Through anointed prayer, worship, and intercession, ground is being taken back from the enemy.

The heavens are being flooded with intercession, the word of God, praise and worship. There is an awakening of sleeping Christians to the times we are in, and joining the army of intercessors in this battle.

There is a greater awareness of the importance and relevance of the centrality of Israel in this hour, and battle, as a bedrock foundation for future events, in Israel and in the nations.

It appears that the unity of one voice, one heart, one cry, one spirit is not just being limited to the Christians and Messianic Jews. There is a rising up of unity and a one voice cry from other organisations and religions around the world..

If you are not in a regular intercessory prayer or intercession/worship group, now is the hour to join forces, to actively participate in the battle for your nation, government, congregation, family, and the fight for Israel's salvation, which out of that will bring redemption for the world.

Micah 4:13 "Its time to Arise and Thresh (work) Arise and thresh, daughter of Zion, For your horn I will make iron and your hoofs I will make bronze, that you may pulverise many peoples."

Israel is still veiled from her Messiah. **Pray** for a revealing, an unveiling, revelation and salvation of the true Jewish Messiah and King of Israel, King of the Jews, for God's people worldwide especially **during Purim.** (26th and 27th February)

Jeremiah 31:34 "for they all shall know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them, says the Lord For I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more."

Many Jews all over the world, secular, traditional, religious, ultra orthodox, reform, Messianic Jews, along with the non Jewish part of the household of God, are beginning to arise together with one heart cry to heaven.

May this united one heart cry, cause God to arise from His throne and send forth His angels, at His command, with His word to earth, to perform it, to bring revelation, truth and knowledge, and His will be done on earth for such a time like never before as this. **Psalm 103:20**

Deanery Synod Report

The Synod met on 16th February with 80 or so members present on Zoom. Rev. Dozie, Di and Kevin represented St. Paul's. In brief, the meeting centered on the adoption of an IW Deanery Plan for ministry and mission going forward. This is not particular to the Island as all Deaneries in the Diocese are required to submit plans to the Bishop and these, when agreed, will form the basis of Diocesan strategy.

The aim is to maximise resources and assets to address the long-term decline in the number of available clergy, congregants and finance. If you would like a copy of the plan 'Highlights' document let Kevin know.

In the proposal, churches/parishes are now grouped into partnerships or 'hubs' to enable collaborative working and sharing etc. You may be interested to see the groups below. As there is no official 'parish reorganisation' in this proposal it wasn't voted on by the Synod and will now be presented to the Bishop/Bishop's Council for consideration.

For St. Paul's it was encouraging to see that those responsible at Deanery level have recognised our position regarding churchmanship and Biblical belief and have set us apart as requested in the recent PCC letter of response.


